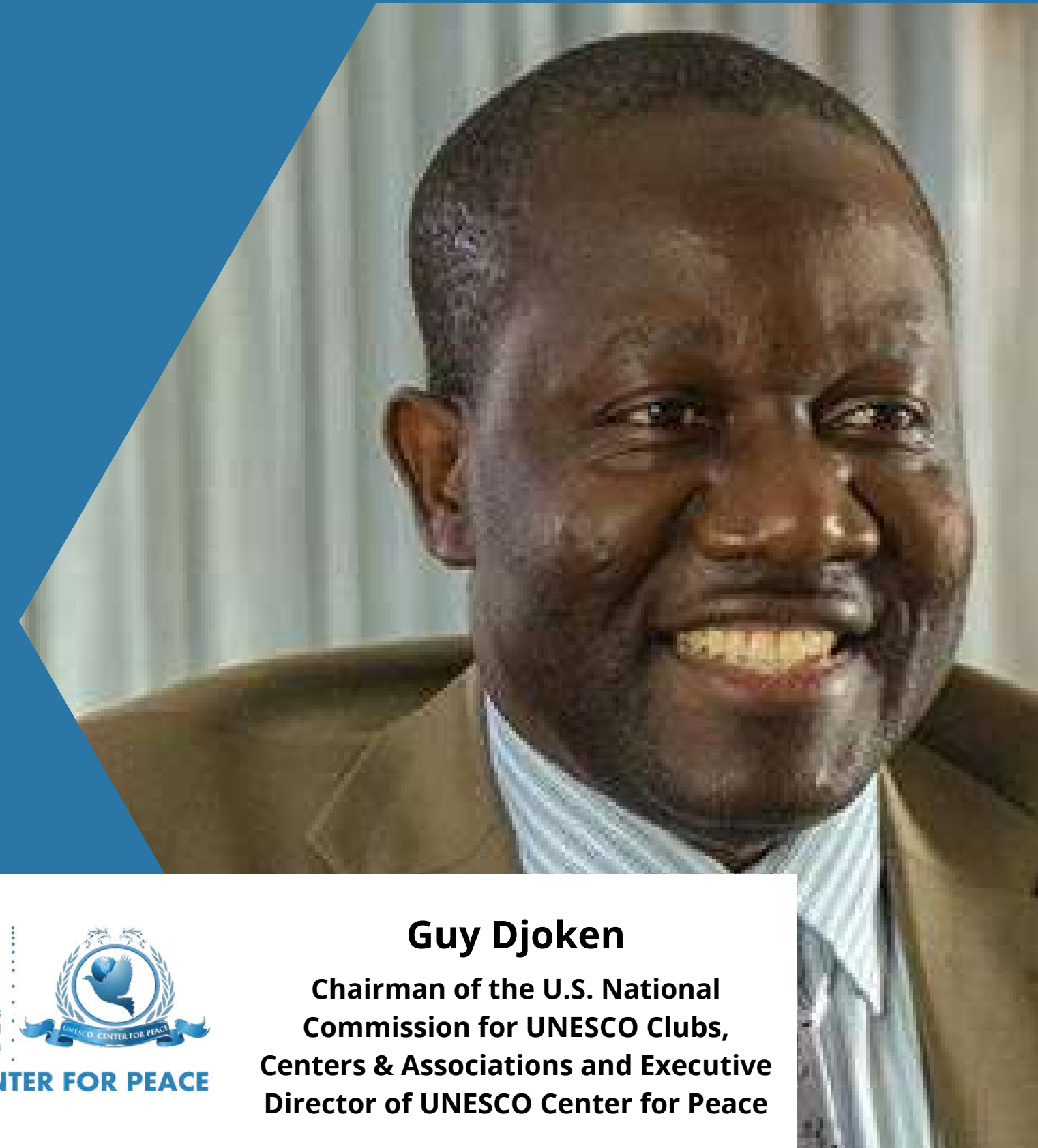

About The Program Objectives



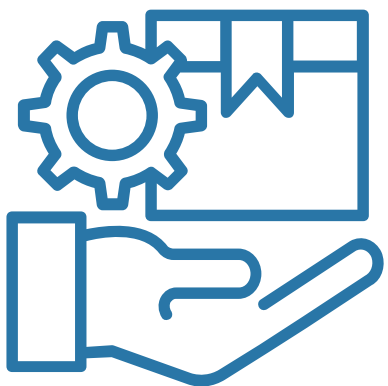
Youth empowerment

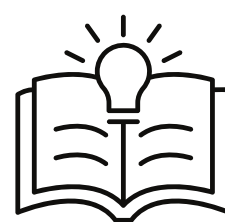


About STEAM Program
